Dear Mr. Wagner:

In October 2025, Acquisition Logistics, LLC (“Acquisition Logistics”) was awarded a contract by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security to provide “detention, transportation, and medical services at Camp East Montana Temporary Detention Center in El Paso, TX.”¹ We understand that this contract was recently terminated.²

Reporting has revealed substantial evidence of mistreatment of and indifference to pregnant, postpartum, and nursing individuals in detention at Camp East Montana, a makeshift ICE detention facility in El Paso, TX. In one instance, a woman reportedly experienced vaginal bleeding and requested medical care, but was given only water, prenatal vitamins, and a temperature check.³ Moreover, she later reported that the facility lacked a doctor.⁴ A separate 911 call from Camp East Montana also reportedly involved a pregnant woman in severe pain with coronavirus.⁵

To better understand the role Acquisition Logistics played in the six months it served as the primary contractor for medical services, including medical services of pregnant, postpartum, and nursing individuals, at Camp East Montana, please provide our offices with the following information by May 21, 2026:

1. How many pregnant, postpartum, and nursing individuals were detained at Camp East Montana during the period Acquisition Logistics managed the facility?

2. How many individuals gave birth while detained at Camp East Montana during Acquisition Logistics' tenure managing the facility?
3. How many children were born to individuals detained at Camp East Montana during Acquisition Logistics' tenure managing the facility?
4. Was Acquisition Logistics responsible for providing direct medical care to pregnant, postpartum, and nursing individuals?
 - a. If yes, please provide an overview of what that care entailed including: the number of doctors, nurses, or other medical staff employed at the facility; the services offered; the hours of coverage; and the protocols and procedures used to respond to urgent or emergency medical complaints including protocols for escalation, transport to off-site care, and physician consultation.
 - b. If no, please provide a list of all subcontracting entities providing medical care for pregnant, postpartum, and nursing individuals, an overview of the medical services provided, and whether such subcontractors performed medical care on site or off-site.
5. Please identify how many pregnant, postpartum, and nursing individuals detained at Camp East Montana during Acquisition Logistics' tenure were:
 - a. transported to a hospital;
 - b. referred for off-site obstetric or gynecological care;
 - c. treated for emergency pregnancy-related complications; or
 - d. reported experiencing miscarriage, stillbirth, or other serious pregnancy-related medical events
6. Provide copies of all solicitation requests published or otherwise sent to subcontractors for the provision of medical services at Camp East Montana.
7. Provide all 911 call recordings made from Camp East Montana involving pregnant, postpartum, and nursing individuals during Acquisition Logistics' tenure. Please redact any personally identifiable information for the recordings to the extent possible. If recordings are not available, due to the inability to redact PII, please clearly indicate this in your response and provide a description of the recording.
8. Provide all policies, guidance, and training materials used by Acquisition Logistics regarding the care of pregnant, postpartum, and nursing individuals.

ICE's July 1, 2021 policy on "Identification and Monitoring of Pregnant, Postpartum, or Nursing Individuals" includes Section 5.4 which requires that pregnant, postpartum, and nursing women receive weekly evaluations to determine whether continued detention is appropriate. Did Acquisition Logistics or its subcontractors perform these weekly evaluations at Camp East Montana?
 - a. If yes, please provide all records⁶ related to such weekly evaluations and indicate whether ICE accepted or rejected the recommendations on continued detention contained therein.

10. Did Acquisition Logistics⁷ or its subcontractors track requests from detained pregnant, postpartum, and nursing individuals detained at Camp East Montana for medical care?
 - a. If yes, what was the average number of days between a request for medical care and the provision of medical care?
 - b. If yes, how many requests were denied, not answered, or not fulfilled within 24 hours?
 - c. If no, how did Acquisition Logistics or its subcontractors stay apprised of the health of pregnant, postpartum, and nursing individuals at Camp East Montana?
