Re: Summary of Documents Newly Received from DHS Whistleblowers

New documents produced to Senator Blumenthal via a disclosure from two DHS whistleblowers who have requested that they not be identified reveal new details about drastic cuts the Trump Administration is making to the training and testing of new ICE Enforcement Removal Operations (ERO) officers. Specifically, these documents provide new evidence regarding: (1) the aggressive graduation targets that ICE aims to achieve for new ERO officers in fiscal 2026; (2) cuts of more than a dozen significant practical examinations which potential ICE ERO officers no longer must undergo; (3) numerous classes which appear to have been wholly cut from the training curriculum for ICE ERO officers; and (4) the drastic reduction in the hours of training for potential ICE ERO officers. These documents appear to directly contradict representations made under oath to Congress by Acting ICE Director Todd Lyons.

Among the revelations from the documents attached hereto are:

- **ICE plans to train nearly 4,000 new ERO officers in FY2026.**

Exhibit 6 is a document dated January 29, 2026, which shows ICE Enforcement Removal Operations (ERO) officers training enrollment and projections for fiscal year 2026. This document reveals at **App. 88** that ICE had enrolled 803 new ERO officers to graduate in 2026 as of January 29, 2026, and projected 3,204 more graduates by the end of fiscal year 2026. This would mean a total of 4,007 newly graduated ICE ERO officers in fiscal year 2026.

- **ICE has eliminated over a dozen practical exams that ICE ERO officers previously needed to pass to graduate and become an ICE officer.**

Exhibit 1 provides the curriculum hours for ICE's ERO Basic Immigration Enforcement Training Program, dated July 2021. **App. 8** lists in detail the written and practical exercise exams an ICE ERO cadet needed to pass to graduate in July 2021. **Exhibit 2, App. 10** is that same list of written exams and practical exercises exams needed for an ICE ERO cadet to graduate in October 2025.

While in July 2021, an ICE ERO cadet needed to complete 25 practical exercise exams to graduate, that same cadet now needs to complete only nine. Practical exams that the Trump Administration has eliminated as a requirement to become an ICE ERO officer include, "Judgement Pistol Shooting," "Determine Removability," "Encounters to Detention," "Detention to Removal," and "Criminal Encounters." All of these are now instead evaluated, if at all, mainly by open-book, multiple-choice written exams and without any graded practical examinations.

- **ICE appears to have entirely cut a significant number of important classes from its ERO officer training.**

Exhibit 3, App. 12 – App. 20 provide the table of contents and general information for the complete syllabus for ICE’s ERO Training program in July 2025, prior to the surge in new officer hiring and training by the Trump Administration. **Exhibit 4, App. 68 – App. 77** provide that same table of contents and general information for ICE’s ERO Training program in February 2026.

A side-by-side comparison of these documents appears to show that a number of courses have been wholly cut from ICE’s training program. For example, **App. 15** compared to **App. 72** appears to show ICE officers previously underwent Use of Force Simulation Training and no longer do so. **App. 16** compared to **App. 73** shows that there are a number of legal trainings ICE ERO officers no longer receive, including training on the United States Government Structure, ERO Authority, Use of Force, and Criminal vs. Removal Proceedings.

- **ICE ERO cadets appear to be receiving significantly fewer hours of training than before, which appears directly counter to Acting Director Lyons’s sworn testimony to Congress.**

On February 12, 2026, Acting ICE Director Todd Lyons testified under oath to Congress that, regarding training of officers, ICE had “reduce[d] the actual calendar days from 75 to 42. We went from five days a week to six days a week. Five days a week was five eight-hour days. We’ve gone to six 12-hour days.”¹

These documents suggest that ICE has not augmented its hours of training to make up for the reduction in training days, indicating that its new officers are receiving hundreds of hours less training than they did before. **Exhibit 3, App. 12 – 20** provides the table of contents and general information for the complete syllabus for ICE’s ERO Training program in July 2025, and **App. 18** specifically notes that the program “consists of 72 training days (excluding weekends and Federal holidays) with a total of 584 hours.” The following section, “Standard Daily Schedule,” provides for a nine-hour day, showing eight-hours if instruction with an hour break for lunch. **Exhibit 4, App. 68 – App. 77** provides that same table of contents and general information for ICE’s ERO Training Program in February 2026, and **App. 75** provides similar details. **App. 75** notes that the program is “42 training days.” Under Daily Schedules, it provides schedules for two separate cohorts of recruits to undertake the same nine-hour days as before. **Exhibit 5** provides a model daily schedule from January 2026, indicating that current ICE trainees are not receiving additional hours of training each day, as Mr. Lyons testified. The schedules reflected on these documents indicate that current ICE recruits receive nearly 250 fewer hours of training than previous cohorts of recruits.

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GENERAL INFORMATION

History of the United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement – Enforcement Removal Operations Basic Immigration Enforcement Training Program

Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) was created in 2003 through a merger of the investigative and interior enforcement elements of the former U.S. Customs Service and the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS). ICE now has more than 20,000 employees in more than 400 offices in the United States and 48 foreign countries. The agency has an annual budget of approximately \$6 billion, primarily devoted to two operational directorates — Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) and Enforcement and Removal Operations (ERO). A third directorate, Management and Administration (M&A), is charged with providing professional management and mission support to advance the ICE mission. ICE's mission is to prevent acts of terrorism by targeting the people, money, and materials that support terrorist and criminal activities. ICE's Vision is to be the nation's preeminent law enforcement agency, dedicated to detecting vulnerabilities and preventing violations that threaten national security. Established to combat the criminal and national security threats emergent in a post 9/11 environment, ICE combines a new investigative approach with new resources to provide unparalleled investigation, interdiction and security services to the public and our law enforcement partners in the federal and local sectors.

Enforcement and Removal Operations

ERO enforces the nation's immigration laws in a fair and effective manner. It identifies and apprehends removable aliens, detains these individuals when necessary and removes illegal aliens from the United States. This unit prioritizes the apprehension, arrest and removal of convicted criminals, those who pose a threat to national security, fugitives and recent border entrants. Individuals seeking asylum also work with ERO.

Homeland Security Investigations

The HSI directorate is responsible for investigating a wide range of domestic and international activities arising from the illegal movement of people and goods into, within and out of the United States.

Management and Administration

ICE's Management and Administration includes professional managers and mission support staff who make the ICE mission possible.

Since March of 2013, the Immigration and Customs Enforcement Deportation (ICE_D) program has undergone a complete curriculum redesign conducted jointly by the ICE Office of Training and Development and FLETC development staff. The ICE_D program name was officially changed to ICE Basic Immigration Enforcement Training Program (ICE_BIETP). To further delineate the duties of ERO, the program was officially changed again in June of 2018 to ICE Enforcement Removal Operations Basic Immigration Enforcement Training Program (ICE_ERO_BIETP).

ICE_ERO_BIETP is categorized as a Center Integrated Basic (CIB) training program for basic investigators primarily charged with enforcing laws and regulations with nexus to immigration and enforcement efforts. The ICE_ERO_BIETP is 15 weeks in length and contains a course total of 571:25. On April 27, 2017, The Federal Law Enforcement Training Accreditation (FLETA) Board granted accreditation status to the ICE_BIETP. Accreditation is a cyclical process occurring every five years. Each year, agencies must submit annual reports in preparation for reaccreditation, which is a new and independent review of the program.

Qualification for Attendance

The primary purpose of the FLETC is to provide basic training to Federal law enforcement officers employed by agencies that authorize their officers to enforce Federal laws, make arrests and carry firearms.

Within these guidelines, each organization applies its own standards in hiring and selecting officers to attend the ICE_ERO_BIETP.

Prerequisites for Attendance

Each Partner Organization sets its standards in recruiting employees. In addition:

- **Participants in the ICE_ERO_BIETP must have successfully passed the Agency Pre-Employment Fitness Test (PFT) PRIOR to being enrolled at the FLETC.** The PFT is a three-part practical exercise designed to assess a trainee's overall physical condition. Failure of any part of the PFT is a failure of the entire test.
- Attendees must meet their agency's recruitment standards and the **FLETC Practical Performance Requirements (PPRs) for the ICE_ERO_BIETP PRIOR TO ARRIVING FOR THE TRAINING PROGRAM.**

Length of Program

The ICE_ERO_BIETP consists of 72 training days (excluding weekends and Federal holidays) with a total of 584 hours.

Standard Daily Schedule

Morning Session: 7:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.*

Lunch: 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

Afternoon Session: 12:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.*

* Classes are typically 50 minutes in length with breaks scheduled according to subject matter being presented and the status of practical exercise activity. Also, beginning and ending times may vary.

Student Evaluation

To receive a certificate of graduation from the ICE_ERO_BIETP, a student must successfully complete each graded segment of the program. This includes written examinations and all graded practical exercises.

Written Examinations

Each student is required to score 70 percent or higher on each of the eight written examinations (ICE: 7 and FLETC: 1). A review is conducted immediately following the FLETC written examination. The review allows students to immediately assess their performance and discuss exam questions. Official examination scores are posted as soon as possible after the examination. Each student's score is maintained in confidentiality. Examination scores are available to the student's agency through official channels.

If a student fails to score 70 percent or higher on any written examination, he/she is placed on academic probation. During this period, additional assistance such as counseling, personal instruction, and additional practice is provided to the student upon request.

FLETC Remedial Exams: Within three working days of the failure date, the student must take a remedial examination.

ICE Remedial Exams: students will be provided with up to 6 hours for remedial training and retested no sooner than 3 training days after the failed test. The student must pass the remedial examination to remain eligible for graduation. Students may waive any portion or all of the remedial training.

In all cases, the remedial exam will evaluate the same enabling performance objectives as the original examination and students may request in writing to be retested sooner.

A student will be placed on academic probation after failure of a regularly scheduled examination. **Only one remedial examination per agency (FLETC/ICE) is permitted during the training program.** If a student fails a second regularly scheduled examination or any remedial written examination, he/she will be dismissed from training and will not receive a certificate of graduation.

Practical Exercises

The second component of the ICE_ERO_BIETP evaluation system is the measurement of performance skills acquired during training. A student must satisfactorily complete all practical exercises (PEs) in order to receive a certificate of graduation. Any student not achieving a passing score on any PE will be placed on academic probation, provided additional training in the skills needed to pass the PE and be required to pass a remedial PE.

Any student, who does not receive at least a "satisfactory" score or evaluation on:
FLETC PEs, students will be given **one** opportunity to remediate the exercise
(maximum remediations: 3)

- Exception: Practical Pistol Course (PPC) qualification administered by FLETC/FAD; students may receive **two** remedial attempts per ICE Firearms Policy (DROPPM Chapter 46.4)

ICE/OPS PEs, students will be given **one** opportunity to remediate the exercise
(maximum remediations: 1)

ICE/FTP PEs, students will be given **one** opportunity to remediate the exercise
(maximum remediations: 1)

If a student subsequently fails the number of allowed remedial attempts for a specific PE or fails any PE in excess to the maximums allowed per section (FLETC, ICE/OTP, ICE/FTP), the student will be dismissed from training and will not receive a certificate of graduation.

Dismissal and Reinstatement

Any student dismissed from training for failing either written examinations or practical exercises may be admitted to a subsequent class of the same program, provided the employing agency (or sponsoring organization) receives advance approval from the Training Management Division (TMD), Division Chief (DC). The student must begin the program on the first training day and successfully complete all written examinations and practical exercises with that class. The student will not be granted credit for previous written examinations or practical exercises. The employing agency must submit such requests in writing, explaining why the student should be admitted and what the student has done to address previous academic and/or practical exercise deficiencies.

Any student dismissed from training for disciplinary reasons will not be admitted to any basic training program without advance approval from the TMD/DC. Such requests will be submitted in writing by the employing agency (or sponsoring organization); explaining why the student should be admitted and what the student and employing agency have done to correct the conduct that previously resulted in dismissal. If the request is approved, the student must begin the program on the first training day and successfully complete all written examinations and practical exercises with that class. The student will not be granted credit for previous written examinations or practical exercises. Students dismissed for cheating will not be reinstated under any circumstances and will not be allowed to attend any other training.

Any student dismissed from training due to his/her medical history or medical condition may be readmitted in a subsequent class of the same program, but only after the employing agency (or sponsoring organization) provides the FLETC with all requested documentation and the FLETC's Medical Review Board concurs that the student can meet the program's PPRs. The request to allow such student to resume training from the point where he/she departed should be addressed to the TMD/DC or delegated authority, which has the sole discretion to approve or deny the request. The TMD/DC may also grant such student credit for previous written examinations and practical exercises, provided the student is admitted to the same program and the program has not changed curriculum content since he/she departed. The specific point in training the student is placed is at the discretion of the TMD/DC.

Given a variety of law enforcement scenarios and force options, the student will apply reasonable force and will articulate the facts that support the force in accordance with the 4th Amendment and the Objective Reasonableness Standard set forth by the U.S. Supreme Court in *Graham v. Connor*.

- Demonstrate reasonable force.
- Articulate the facts supporting the use of force in accordance with the constitutional standard.
- Demonstrate firearm weapon handling skills.
- Demonstrate firearm marksmanship skills.
- Demonstrate safe weapon handling.

NOTE: CTT tasks will begin with the trainee seated in the driver's seat of government vehicle with the seatbelt fastened and 20 feet away from the first obstacle/task, a six-foot wall barrier:

- Task 1 – Six-Foot Wall
- Task 2 – Culvert Crawl

- Task 4 – Staircase
- Task 5 – Culvert Crawl (2nd time)
- Task 6 – Pre-cuffing Maneuver
- Task 7 – Downed/Disabled Officer Drag

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HISTORY OF THE FEDERAL LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING CENTERS

The Federal Law Enforcement Training Centers (FLETC) is an Organizational Element of the Department of Homeland Security. The FLETC was established as a bureau of the Treasury Department in 1970 to provide consolidated basic training to the increasing number of Federal law enforcement agencies. Two government studies in the late 1960's found Federal law enforcement agencies needed a facility where a cadre of professional instructors could deliver high-quality, cost-effective, standardized courses to agents and officers from various agencies.

The FLETC began training operations in temporary facilities in Washington, D. C, in 1970. The FLETC's permanent location had been planned for the Washington, D.C. area; however, a three-year construction delay prompted Congress to request a survey of surplus Federal installations that could serve as a permanent training site. In May 1975, the former Glynco Naval Air Station in southeast Georgia was selected as the permanent site for the FLETC. In September 1975, the FLETC relocated from Washington, D.C. and began training operations at Glynco. Over the years, satellite training centers in Artesia, New Mexico, Charleston, South Carolina, and Cheltenham, Maryland have been established to provide the same high-quality training.

Today, Glynco serves as an interagency law enforcement training facility for over 95 Federal organizations throughout the United States and its territories. Many of these organizations conduct their agency's law enforcement training operations at Glynco, and more than 30 organizations have on-site offices to oversee their training programs.

Thirteen basic law enforcement training programs, ranging from 3 to 19 weeks, are conducted at the FLETC. The FLETC also delivers many advanced and specialized programs for Federal partner organizations. Other organizations may also attend these programs on a space-available basis.

The FLETC also offers approximately 45 specialized training programs for state and local law enforcement personnel. These programs are designed to meet training needs not generally available to state and local agencies and to enhance networking and cooperation throughout the law enforcement community.

The FLETC's consolidated law enforcement training programs allow the Federal government to deliver high-quality, cost-effective, standardized training programs to over 90 Federal agencies. The professional cadre of experienced instructors, which consists of permanent FLETC staff and agency-detailed instructors, is a key component of this consolidated training structure. The Center's professional instruction and emphasis on practical applications provides students with the knowledge and skills they need to succeed as Federal law enforcement officers.

Additionally, the FLETC's consolidated training environment allows students from various agencies to interact in training exercises and after-hours social events. This interaction results in an increased understanding and appreciation of the duties and missions of colleagues from different agencies and fosters a more cooperative working environment.

Since 1970 the FLETC has established and maintained a proud tradition of excellence in law enforcement training. That tradition of excellence continues as the FLETC prepares Federal law enforcement officers for the ever-changing laws and challenges of the new millennia.

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GENERAL INFORMATION

History of the United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement– Enforcement Removal Operations Basic Immigration Enforcement Training Program

Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) was created in 2003 through a merger of the investigative and interior enforcement elements of the former U.S. Customs Service and the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS). ICE now has more than 20,000 employees in more than 400 offices in the United States and 48 foreign countries. The agency has an annual budget of approximately \$6 billion, primarily devoted to two operational directorates — Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) and Enforcement and Removal Operations (ERO). A third directorate, Management and Administration (M&A), is charged with providing professional management and mission support to advance the ICE mission. ICE's mission is to prevent acts of terrorism by targeting the people, money, and materials that support terrorist and criminal activities. ICE's Vision is to be the nation's preeminent law enforcement agency, dedicated to detecting vulnerabilities and preventing violations that threaten national security. Established to combat the criminal and national security threats emergent in a post 9/11 environment, ICE combines a new investigative approach with new resources to provide unparalleled investigation, interdiction and security services to the public and our law enforcement partners in the federal and local sectors.

Enforcement and Removal Operations

ERO enforces the nation's immigration laws in a fair and effective manner. It identifies and apprehends removable aliens, detains these individuals when necessary and removes illegal aliens from the United States. This unit prioritizes the apprehension, arrest and removal of convicted criminals, those who pose a threat to national security, fugitives and recent border entrants. Individuals seeking asylum also work with ERO.

Homeland Security Investigations

The HSI directorate is responsible for investigating a wide range of domestic and international activities arising from the illegal movement of people and goods into, within and out of the United States.

Management and Administration

Ice's Management and Administration include professional managers and mission support staff who make the ICE mission possible.

Since March of 2013, the Immigration and Customs Enforcement Deportation (ICE_D) program has undergone a complete curriculum redesign conducted jointly by the ICE Office of Training and Development and FLETC development staff. The ICE D program name was officially changed to ICE Basic Immigration Enforcement Training Program (ICE BIETP). To further delineate the duties of ERO, the program was officially changed again in June of 2018 to ICE Enforcement Removal Operations Basic Immigration Enforcement Training Program (ICE_ERO_BIETP).

ICE_ERO_BIETP is categorized as a Center Integrated Basic (CIB) training program for basic investigators primarily charged with enforcing laws and regulations with nexus to immigration and enforcement efforts. The ICE_ERO_BIETP is 42 days in length.

Qualification for Attendance

The primary purpose of the FLETC is to provide basic training to Federal law enforcement officers employed by agencies that authorize their officers to enforce Federal laws, make arrests and carry firearms.

Within these guidelines, each organization applies its own standards in hiring and selecting officers to attend the ICE ERO BIETP.

Prerequisites for Attendance

Each Partner Organization sets its standards in recruiting employees. In addition:

- Participants in the ICE ERO BIETP must have successfully passed the Agency Pre-Employment Fitness Test (PFT) PRIOR to being enrolled at the FLETC. The PFT is a three-part practical exercise designed to assess a trainee's overall physical condition. Failure of any part of the PFT is a failure of the entire test.
- Attendees must meet their agency's recruitment standards and the FLETC Practical Performance Requirements (PPRs) for the ICE ERO BIETP PRIOR TO ARRIVING FOR THE TRAINING PROGRAM.

Length of Program

42 training days.

Daily Schedules

Morning Sessions: 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Afternoon Sessions: 12:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m.

Classes are typically 50 minutes in length with breaks scheduled according to subject matter being presented and the status of practical exercise activity. Also, beginning and ending times may vary.

Student Evaluation

To receive a certificate of graduation from the ICE ERO BIETP, a student must successfully complete each graded segment of the program. This includes written examinations and all graded practical exercises.

Written Examinations

Each student is required to score 70 percent or higher on each written examination. A review is conducted immediately following the FLETC written examination. The review allows students to immediately assess their performance and discuss exam questions. Official examination scores are posted as soon as possible after the examination. Each student's score is maintained in confidentiality. Examination scores are available to the student's agency through official channels.

If a student fails to score 70 percent or higher on any written examination, he/she is placed on academic probation. During this period, additional assistance such as counseling, personal instruction, and additional practice is provided to the student upon request.

FLETC Remedial Exams: Within three working days of the failure date, the student must take a remedial examination.

ICE Remedial Exams: students will be provided with up to 6 hours for remedial training and retested no sooner than 3 training days after the failed test. The student must pass the remedial examination to remain eligible for graduation. Students may waive any portion or all of the remedial training.

In all cases, the remedial exam will evaluate the same enabling performance objectives as the original examination and students may request in writing to be retested sooner.

A student will be placed on academic probation after failure of a regularly scheduled examination. Only one remedial examination per agency (FLETC/ICE) is permitted during the training program. If a student fails a second regularly scheduled examination or any remedial written examination, he/she will be dismissed from training and will not receive a certificate of graduation.

Practical Exercises

The second component of the ICE ERO BIETP evaluation system is the measurement of performance skills acquired during training. A student must satisfactorily complete all practical exercises (PEs) in order to receive a certificate of graduation. Any student not achieving a passing score on any PE will be placed on academic probation, provided additional training in the skills needed to pass the PE and be required to pass a remedial PE.

Any student, who does not receive at least a "satisfactory" score or evaluation on: FLETC PEs, students will be given one opportunity to remediate the exercise (maximum remediations: 3)

- Exception: Practical Pistol Course (PPC) qualification administered by FLETC/FAD; students may receive two remedial attempts per ICE Firearms Policy (DROPPM Chapter 46.4)

ICE/OPS PEs, students will be given one opportunity to remediate the exercise (maximum remediations: 1)

ICE/PT PEs, students will be given one opportunity to remediate the exercise (maximum remediations: 1)

If a student subsequently fails the number of allowed remedial attempts for a specific PE or fails any PE in excess to the maximums allowed per section (FLETC, ICE/OTP, ICE/PT), the student will be dismissed from training and will not receive a certificate of graduation.

Dismissal and Reinstatement

Any student dismissed from training for failing either written examinations or practical exercises may be admitted to a subsequent class of the same program, provided the employing agency (or sponsoring organization) receives advance approval from the Training Management Division (TMD), Division Chief (DC). The student must begin the program on the first training day and successfully complete all written examinations and practical exercises with that class. The student will not be granted credit for previous written examinations or practical exercises. The employing agency must submit such requests in writing, explaining why the student should be admitted and what the student has done to address previous academic and/or practical exercise deficiencies.

Any student dismissed from training for disciplinary reasons will not be admitted to any basic training program without advance approval from the TMD/DC. Such requests will be submitted in writing by the employing agency (or sponsoring organization), explaining why the student should be admitted and what the student and employing agency have done to correct the conduct that previously resulted in dismissal. If the request is approved, the student must begin the program on the first training day and successfully complete all written examinations and practical exercises with that class. The student will not be granted credit for previous written examinations or practical exercises. Students dismissed for cheating will not be reinstated under any circumstances and will not be allowed to attend any other training.

Any student dismissed from training due to his/her medical history or medical condition may be readmitted in a subsequent class of the same program, but only after the employing agency (or sponsoring organization) provides the FLETC with all requested documentation and the FLETC's Medical Review Board concurs that the student can meet the program's PPRs. The request to allow such student to resume training from the point where he/she departed should be addressed to the TMD/DC or delegated authority, which has the sole discretion to approve or deny the request. The TMD/DC may also grant such student credit for previous written examinations and practical exercises, provided the student is admitted to the same program and the program has not changed curriculum content since he/she departed. The specific point in training the student is placed at the discretion of the TMD/DC.
